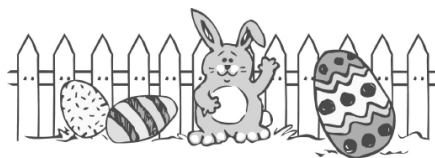
The HOA will also place signs along Legacy Park Boulevard at the middle of May as we have in years past.

HOA News & Information

PROPERTY MANAGEMENT REPORT

Now that warmer weather is here, we can begin the construction of our own Legacy Park Parking Decks. The location will be the end of Town Green near the Baseball Field and the wooded area between Winterthur and the lake. With street parking being such an issue all over the neighborhood, the HOA has decided the best option is to build a structure with 24-hour shuttle service to and from your homes and LP amenities. We're working with Uber now to outfit a fleet of golf carts. Applications for drivers will be accepted beginning **April 31st**.

In an effort to keep our deer population safe, the HOA has decided to install a new 30-foot net around the baseball field, where the deer will be herded at dusk. This should cut down on the number of close calls while driving around the circle at night and coyote sightings. The HOA has also decided to use the sunny area in front of the Bandstand to start growing corn to be able to feed the deer overnight. It will also double as a corn maze for PumpkinFest.

Due to the number of people who do not use our stop signs correctly, the HOA has decided to remove them around the circle. This should cut down on the number of complaints received by the office and improve the drive time around the circle. With this change, the HOA will be building pedestrian fly over sidewalks out of each neighborhood on the outside of the circle and the main entrance. We hope you enjoy this new feature.

To alleviate the questions of which food trucks will be coming on our event days, the HOA has decided to enlist the services of a Town Crier. The Town Crier will be stationed at the island (entrance to Legacy Park Circle) and will announce every 5 minutes on the day before and the day of the event. Please arrive with your windows down, so you will be able to hear. Please also congratulate Bill O'Rourke on his new role with the HOA.

As you may have noticed, our pool furniture has been delivered for the upcoming season. In order to keep the pool area cleaner, you will now check out your chair from the concession stand. You may use the number of chairs that your ID allows, for example, if you and 2 guests would like to use the chair, you may check out 3 chairs. This will keep our pool furniture in great shape for many more years than expected, thus saving money for other projects, and everyone loves saving money!

ARE YOU GOING OUT OF TOWN?

Did you know that the city of Kennesaw Police Department offers an on vacation house check?

Simply visit the Kennesaw Police web site kennesaw-ga.gov. The Kennesaw Police Department will check your residence several times daily while you are out of town. House checks are performed free of charge to City residents while away on vacation or business. Request forms are available at the police departments' office, or you can fill out the form online.

Speaking of future projects, we will be adding paddle boards and innertubes to the creek. It will be named, "Paddling the Proctor." The route will begin at the Winterthur bridge, and you will float along to the bridge at Town Green. Please be advised that there will be flying discs to look out for along the route, but it beats the drive to Helen. Enjoy!

WHO HAS A DRAINAGE ISSUE?

With all the rain we had last year, drainage issues have been appearing throughout the community. The HOA has addressed several issues on the common property and has heard that many properties in Kentmere seem to be having some issues as well. There are many stormwater drainage areas that run between the properties and at the back of homeowner's lots. These areas are normally owned by the individual homeowner, which means it is the homeowner's responsibility. Each homeowner should refer to the plat of their property for further clarification. If your plat does not indicate you adjoin common property, the HOA is not responsible for the area. However, if you have some type of permanent drainage structure on your property, then you should contact the City of Kennesaw Storm Water Management for further clarification.

Generally, this is an owner-to-owner issue for which the Association has no responsibility or obligation to address. However, the HOA will be sending out letters to owners that need to address some specific issues; such as, the accumulation of trash and other items that need to be removed. The HOA can't see the backyard of all the homes, but your next-door neighbor usually can. Legacy Park Rules and Regulations provide that rear yards may be sodded, seeded or treated naturally but must be kept tidy and not have a negative impact on adjacent property owners. All property owners are required to provide regular landscape maintenance of their yards.

Please take some time to look at the accumulation of limbs, leaves, trash, etc., that may be at the back of your yard and develop a plan to get it cleaned up. If your backyard is fenced, make sure any area behind the fence that is yours is cleaned up. The owners who live at the mid and lower points of the streets, are having some real issues with the water runoff and the debris that is in your yard may be causing some of these problems. Please do your part in being a responsible neighbor.

BEAUTIFUL SPRING LANDSCAPES AHEAD!

We appreciate all that our residents do to maintain a nice landscape! It really does add to the beauty of our community!

When mowing and applying fertilizer, please be sure to clear any debris that may be left on the sidewalk as you finish your process. This not only looks neater, but also promotes better safety for those using the sidewalks. Also remember that the maximum number of lawn debris bags that will be picked up without bulk pick up arrangements is **15**.

A NOTE ABOUT COVENANTS

Did you know that this is the time to assess your house and see if it is in need of power washing and possibly painting?

Most paint jobs last up to 8-10 years maximum, due to the sun and other elements. Wood rot is a big issue with the windows, and should be completed before the house is painted. Keep in mind **that you have to get all colors approved, (even if it was approved the last time by the ARC)?**

Color trends change and as much as we keep within the architectural character of the houses, colors can still be updated and make for a fresh new look for your house.

With all of the rain we had this winter, many homes have wood rot. Check over your window sills, doorways, garage door frames, and areas with trim pieces and gable vents. These areas could be easily repaired now, whereas waiting can cause bigger issues resulting in a higher price tag.

Also due to the dampness, mailboxes and siding are growing algae. If your mailbox or the side of your house are green, it needs some attention. In some cases, just pressure washing does the trick.

GUEST POLICY

As you are out enjoying the amenities in Legacy Park, please keep in mind the Guest Policy as summarized below:

Up to four (4) guests will be allowed per resident **over the age of 18** for use of the Trails, Town Green, Playgrounds, Amphitheater, Bandstand, and Baseball Field. Residents must have a valid Legacy Park ID with them at all times to use the amenities.

Up to two (2) guests will be allowed per resident **over the age of 18** for the use of the Swimming Pools, Tennis Courts, Volleyball Court and Basketball Court. Residents must have a valid Legacy Park ID with them at all times to use the amenities.

Unaccompanied children between the **ages of 12 and 18** are allowed only one (1) guest while on LP property and when using the amenities. Residents must have a valid Legacy Park ID with them at all times to use the amenities.

Guests are considered to be non-LP residents. LP residents that have had their privileges revoked cannot come as a guest of another resident.

A LP resident must accompany guests while on the common properties or while using any of the amenities. Long term guests (persons visiting for more than two weeks) may obtain a guest pass from the HOA office. As a reminder, homeowners are responsible for ensuring that their guests are informed of the rules of LP and that these guests follow the rules at all times. *The LP HOA reserves the right to suspend privileges or prosecute an individual, resident or guest, for destruction, abuse or misuse of property.*

2019 POOL SEASON – POOLS OPEN MAY 4TH

We want to ensure that our facilities are used by Legacy Park residents and their guests only, so be ready to show your Legacy Park ID with your 2019 sticker. This will be strictly enforced, so don't leave home without it!

Opening: All the pools will open on Saturday, May 4th and will be guarded on the weekends per the hours below through May 19. The Lullwater Pool will be staffed daily 4 p.m. – 9 p.m. (May 4-22) and the Main & Winterthur Pools will be staffed May 20 – 22 from 4 p.m. – 10 p.m. Beginning May 23 – August 2 the pools will be guarded as listed below:

LEGACY PARK ID – DON'T LEAVE HOME WITHOUT IT!

All Legacy Park residents over the age of 12 must carry their Legacy Park picture ID with them while on Legacy Park property. If you do not have your ID, you will be asked to leave the Legacy Park common areas and amenities. If you have a zero account balance with the HOA, you will receive your 2019 stickers in the mail early in April.

Don't forget to get your electronic access card, which will get you into the gates at the Main Pool and the Lullwater Pool. If you have lost your ID, you may obtain a replacement at the office. All replacement cards are \$10.00.

If you have a card that gains you access to the gym and/or Quiet Pool, you are all set for this season, just put your 2019 sticker on it!

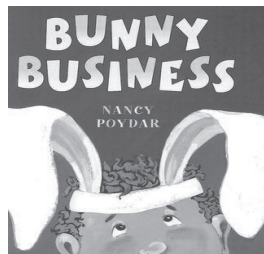

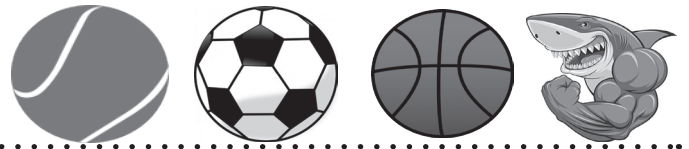

To the residents of Legacy Park: Please exercise caution with parked vehicles on the circle as well as noting all the kiddos entering & exiting the areas between Kentmere through Palisades. Much appreciated.

TENNIS:

2019 dues need to have been paid by February 28th for those participating on a Spring ALTA or USTA mixed roster. The cost is \$40/ Resident Adult and \$25/Resident Junior. Or, if it is more favorable, there is a family plan available for \$100. SAFETY HAS TO BE THE #1 PRIORITY

The spring sports have started again in Legacy Park and the circle will be especially crowded on Saturday mornings! Please follow the guidelines below when parking along the circle within Legacy Park. Failure to do so could result in ticketing and or towing by the City of Kennesaw.

- Only park on the **INSIDE** of the circle
- Only park **WITH** the flow of traffic
- Do not park within 30' of an intersection – **IT'S ILLEGAL AND DANGEROUS.** As a reminder, the HOA has painted curbs white at intersections and loading and unloading zones and have installed no parking signs. Parking on the grass or the Town Green is prohibited, as is driving onto the gravel trails!
- Do **NOT** park in front of the fire hydrants.

The HOA and the Kennesaw Police Department still receive many complaints about cars parked **in front of the tennis courts.** Please be courteous to all drivers when parking in this area and do **NOT** block the passing traffic.

The following report was provided at the February Board Meeting:

2019 Annual Meeting & Election –The 2019 Annual Meeting was a success with a packed room and some great information provided by Mayor Easterling, Chief Westberger and Representative Ed Setzler. Members had a chance to speak with City Council Members as well. The election concluded at on February 22nd and the results were announced at the meeting and published with the meeting minutes.

Spring Mailout – The 2019 amenity mailout is planned for early April. Each family will receive four stickers for their amenity IDs.

2019 Projects:

Landscape – We have completed some extensive cleanup on our trails and the outside of Legacy Park Circle, removing dead trees and tree limbs that hang over the trails and sidewalks. The landscape around the Main Pool area has been complete by removing the river birch trees in the fenced area and in front of the pool house. Plant material has been removed and heavy pruning of the bushes between the Quiet & Main pools has been completed.

Drainage repairs have been made along the power lines in Madison, the entrance to Madison and on the circle behind a Kentmere home, and area adjacent to the Quiet Pool fence along the stone walkway.

The irrigation project along Legacy Park Circle is approved and scheduled, along with new zoysia that will be installed in the beauty strip and along the circle where there is no grass. The refreshing of mulch is scheduled as well.

Swimming Pools – All new pool furniture has been delivered and new fences at the Lullwater & Quiet pools have been installed. Repairs and painting are approved and scheduled for all pool houses. A new motor is approved for the Main Pool. New pool signs have been ordered. A new bicycle rack is scheduled to be installed at the Lullwater Poolhouse.

Painting – Repairs and painting area scheduled for the Sign Boards, Belltower, Bandstand, Amphitheater and Tennis Pavilion.

Tennis Courts – LED lights are installed on Court 1 and will be installed all on courts this spring. Tennis court repairs & resurfacing is approved and scheduled for courts 2, 3, 6 and 7. All tennis court fences will be repaired as well. The replacement of the seat wall next to Tennis Court 1 is approved and scheduled.

Basketball Court – The fence and gate are scheduled to be repaired and new nets are installed.

Clubhouse – Additional rocking chairs have been ordered for the exterior and we are working on replacing interior furnishings.

Playgrounds – The playgrounds have been inspected and we are working on repairs and refreshing the mulch.

- Prune early spring flowering shrubs after blooming complete

- Apply pre-emergent to turf and planting beds.
- Apply post-emergent to control weeds as necessary
- Fertilize spring flowering bulbs after blooms fade. Fertilize azaleas and camellias after blooming

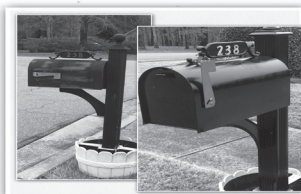

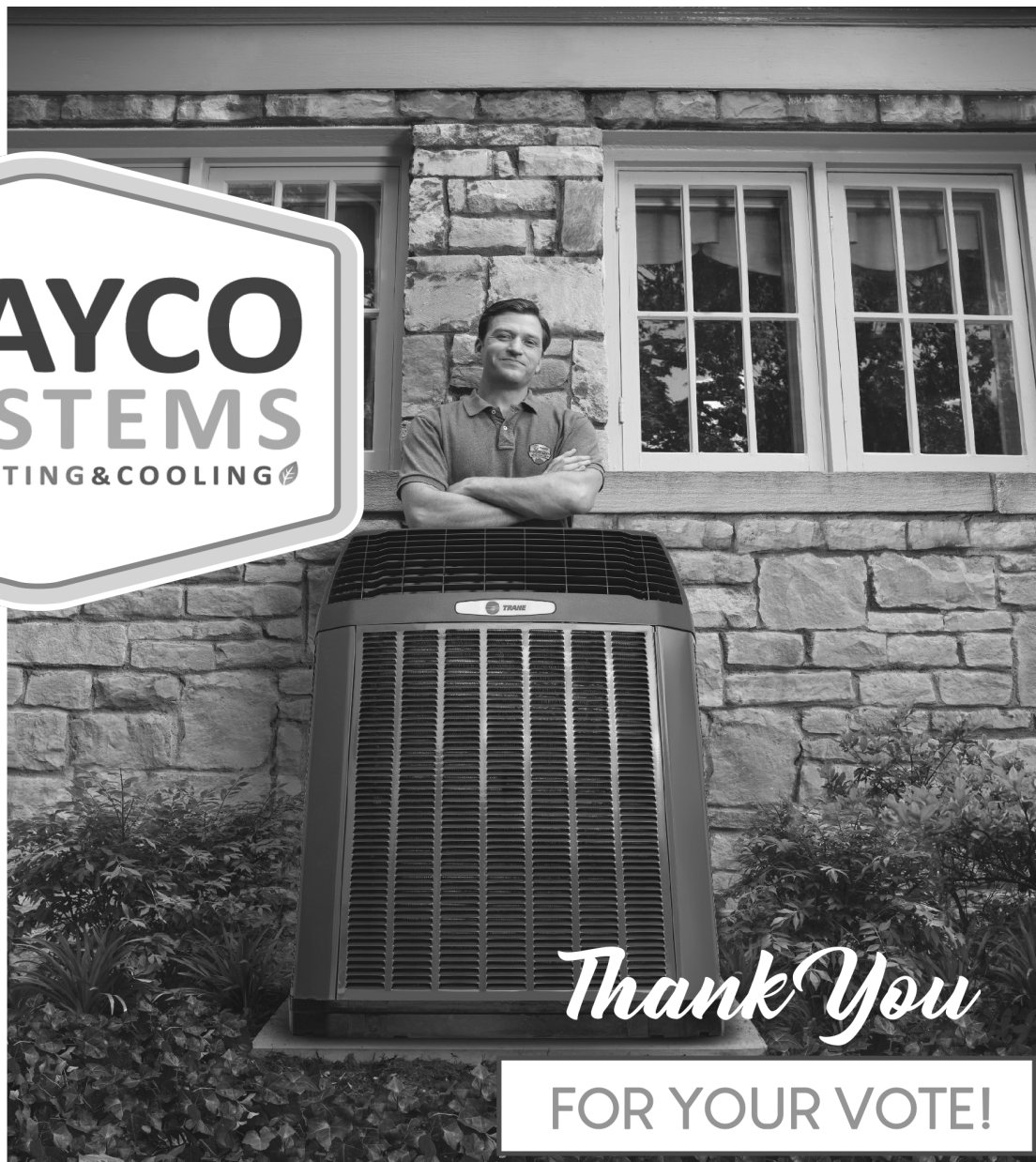
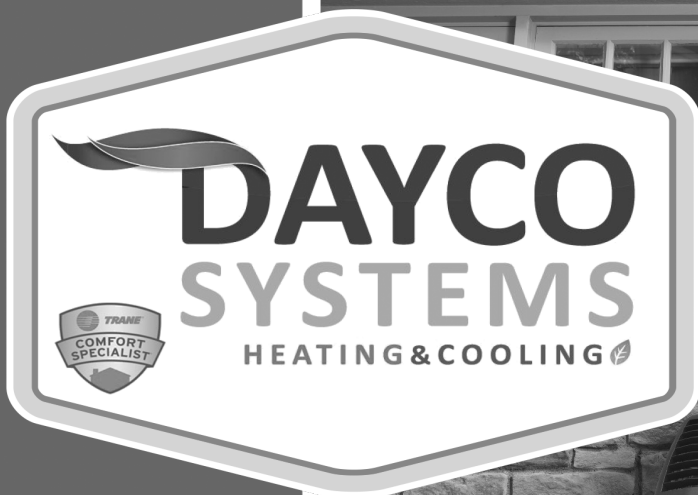
