HOA News & Information

It's only February, and we've already been busy with projects! The pump room at our main pool will be getting a face lift after a malfunction at the end of pool season 2019. The new configuration will make it much easier to perform maintenance! **Speaking of pool season, mark your calendars for opening day May 2nd!**

We're also working on the lake, which encompasses the fountain, beaver dam, and newly discovered otters that are now calling the lake home. Both the beavers and otters have a mission to destroy the fountain, so to combat this, we'll be pulling the fountain out of the lake until the wildlife issues are under control. We'll begin deconstructing the beaver dam as soon as the area dries. While the fountain is out, we'll have it thoroughly repaired, with a new power cable installed, and beaver proofed. Hopefully, this will deter any more chewing.

We have 4 new landscape projects that were approved and budgeted for in 2020. The raised bed at the circle entrance, Kentmere playground, Palisades portal entrance to Town Green, and the large round bed at the Main Pool Bathrooms will be updated and renovated over the course of the year. We're excited to see these projects finished!

ELECTION REMINDERS

During the election process, please remember that the HOA does not endorse any candidate(s). The HOA handles the official communication of election details to residents, along with Vote-Now. This specific process allows the residents to have all the information available regarding all the candidates before they cast a vote. Other information may be sent by the individual candidates. Neither the Board of Directors, Election Committee nor HOA staff members will be involved in the collection or counting of any of thevotes cast. Vote-Now is responsible for this process. In your voting package, you will receive all contact information if you have questions about casting your vote.

The official communication includes:

- Correspondence on LP HOA letterhead;
- The Legacy Park Town Herald newsletter;
- Legacy Park website; and
- Legacy Park e-mail distribution from the property manager and/or Vote Now.

These communication tools are controlled and maintained by the Legacy Park HOA. The HOA does NOT maintain or control any social media websites, except for the information only "Legacy Park Community Association" Facebook Page which can be found at https://www.facebook.com/legacyparkhoa/.

It is not a violation of the Association's governing documents for members (homeowners) to campaign for Board positions or to go door to door.

If you want to guarantee how your vote is counted, you must vote electronically or complete, sign & mail your Ballot to Vote-Now. The Ballot mailed to you includes all possible candidates through the date of the mail-out.

A Note from Covenants...

This time of year seems to make things that need to be addressed on our homes even more obvious. It may be a good time to take an objective walk around your property to see if you're in need of a few cosmetic tweaks before they become larger issues.

Some of the most common things we're seeing now are:

- Mailboxes and number plates in need of repair. Did you know the HOA office has brass numbers for those neighborhoods that use them and paint pens in brass and silver for you to borrow? We also have the contact information for professionals that can paint, repair, and replace mailboxes and posts.
- Landscaping that needs to be replaced because of age. Do you have shrubbery that has bare spots when it's supposed to be green? If your landscaping needs life support, we're more than happy to help get you on the road to recovery.
- Homes that need pressure washing. Is your driveway growing algae from all of the rain? Your house too? A quick pressure wash will help take that away and leave everything sparkling just in time for spring.
- Homes that need painting. Is your home not quite the color you remember it being last year? Sometimes all it needs is a good cleaning, other times, it needs a full painting.
- Overgrown trees. We love them, but sometimes they tend to get a little too big for their intended spots in our yards. It may be time to give the trees in your life a hair cut. If you plan to take trees totally out, please contact the City of Kennesaw for a permit.
- Sod replacement. Does your yard have bald spots or spots that are very thin? It may be time to think about resodding if it doesn't come back in as lush and thick as it once was in the spring.

As always, any update you would like to do needs approval from the ARC BEFORE completion, including roofs, windows, doors, etc. Modification forms are available in the Knowledge Base at www.legacypark.org and in the HOA office. How to Watch the Birds and Mute a Woodpecker

On cold winter days, curled up in our nests, we'll sit facing our favorite screens. Tuning out the outside world, we tune in to the hours of entertainment we love to enjoy. There are plenty of screens lying around almost every corner of our homes, many through which we can watch the most natural of Nature Channels and the real-est of Reality Shows. Through these window screens we can see exciting episodes of bird behavior so thrilling even Hitchcock would give back his Golden Globe. An Animal Planet with gripping scenes that tune us in to our world outside.

Watch as The Real Housewives, Robin and Wren, compete live for a same nesting box on which they've both set their sights. *Spoiler Alert* Almost every season Wren will win by destroying Robin's eggs.

See the Bachelorette Cardinal chirping loudly, mimicking a baby's cry. She follows the targeted male like a stalker at the gym, hoping to catch his eye. If her charms pay off, he'll take this cute chick to dinner and feed her worms; Lady and the Tramp style.

If you're more of a Bachelor fan, tune into the Mourning Dove. Listen to the theme song of his lonely heart, a sorrowful ballad of, "Who? Who?". Who will become his one true love?

But the most infamous and troublesome of these rooftop performers is The Masked Singer. Eyes behind swaths of red or black, this raucous Rockstar of a Woodpecker advertises for groupies. He bangs out his romantic rhythms on the loudest instrument he can find, usually your gutter. He plays this heavy metal drum as if cranked up to eleven. You can barely hear yourself think! But nerves be soothed. You can mute this noisy show by just providing catering. He'll choose to eat at your particular venue instead of play his Dating Game there.

The least expensive, easiest, and best way to set up a Food Network in winter is with a \$3 suet cage found at the grocery store. The high-fat content in a suet brick packs on warming insulation. Just attach the feeder flat to the trunk of a tree. The higher it hangs, the larger the visitor. There's even a chance of luring the ever-allusive Pileated Woodpecker, the largest of all feeder birds! This exotic fellow looks like a direct descendant of Woody Woodpecker himself.

Attracting birds to your winter yard will channel hours of entertainment while bringing substantial benefits to your ecosystem every season of the year. Resident birds love to feast on unwanted pests and aphids. And of course, are known for being pollinators. Why not let them give your flowers a jumpstart on spring?

And while on the subject of landscapes and spring, I'll address the flying elephant in the room. The Landscape Committee is attending regular meetings with the HOA board while working hand-in-hand with our property manager to ensure the front entrance reflects every bit of the grace and splendor for which our neighborhood is proud to be known. We look forward to seeing the beautiful results when the project is complete, and a bounty of greenery and flowers are growing headlong in the sun.

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
