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2020 SPRING AMENITIES INFO

It's hard to believe, but yes, spring is just around the corner and so is pool season. As a rule of thumb, the pools open the first weekend in May each year, however we all know this year will be different. As of now, we do not know when the pools will be open, but we have worked to ensure that we're ready to go when they are. The Lullwater, Main, and Quiet pools have an electronic access gate, so make sure you get a new ID if you don't already have a card with access! If the back of your card has a serial number on the bottom, you have an electronic card. If in doubt, call, email or stop by the office so we can verify this for you. Please remember that replacement ids are \$10.

We had hoped to have Winterthur on the same access system, but due to recent events, we were not able to have the necessary utility lines installed. This gate will be up and running in early June. In the meantime, the same codes as last year are still applicable. Please contact the office if you need a reminder.

The HOA office has sent out 2020 amenity stickers to homeowners who have a zero balance on their account, i.e., no outstanding assessments, fees or fines. If you did not receive stickers, please contact the office.

Buildium Owners Portal Access

If you haven't set up your owner's account through Buildium, please go to https://legacypark.managebuilding.com/Resident/portal/login. *Note, under "Where do you live?" you'll select Legacy Park Community Association Inc. After selecting the association, you'll see another drop down menu with unit #s.

You will need your unit number. Your unit number is the first 2 letters of your street name followed by the first letter of your street type. For example, if you live at 1234 Main Street, your unit number is MAS1234. If you have any problems or have questions, please reach out to the office.

After you set up your account, you'll be able to pay monthly for 2021 Assessments. If you have montly payments set up through your bank, we'd ask that you switch to Buildium. Payments are automatically applied to your account instead of your bank mailing us a check.

On the Lake

With the fountain up and running again, the continuous flow of water will aerate the lake and make it a healthier environment for our grass carp to thrive when we add them to the lake. The healthy carp will bring many benefits to our lake water itself. They are vegetarians and don't need other fish to survive. Eating overgrown grasses and algae is a favorite of these bottom skinners. And because they shave off the top of the vegetation instead of pulling it up by its roots, they stir up less mud which helps keep the water clear on the surface. Grass carp are considered an invasive species in the wild, but the fish stocked in human-made ponds and lakes like ours are sterile. The grass carp's ornamental carp cousins are koi and goldfish. And believe it or not, they are ALL members of the minnow family!

Now that the beavers have been relocated, the great blue heron will likely pick through any leftover dam rubble and find sticks hewn conveniently well for building their platform nests. With a wingspan of 5 ½ to 6 ½ feet, this seemingly massive bird weighs in at only 6 pounds. Mr. Heron has his hollow bones to thank for that. The lifespan of a great blue heron is around 15 years old. But the oldest one ever recorded was believed to be over 24!

They prefer fish but will also hunt mammals, small birds, frogs, and newts.

The eastern newt produces slightly toxic skin secretions to defend itself against predators like the heron but may still fall prey to foxes, grass snakes, and other birds as well. After fertilization, the female lays between 200-400 eggs individually over the next several weeks. She'll lay them one at a time on a specially selected piece of pond plant. Sniffing the leaf to make sure it has the right cellulose amount and then after laying one egg closes the leaf around it with her back legs and glues it shut over the egg. Newts hibernate in winter, usually under logs and stones and in yard waste piles. Some individuals occasionally spend the winter at the bottom of ponds. An eastern newt can expect to live 12 – 15 years in the wild.

There's a bounty of wildlife sharing a home in our Lake. Be sure to make it a destination on your family walks this season to spot what new things you can see and learn about what you find!

On the Lawn

According to Lawncare expert Kelly Burke, there are five conditions that may be keeping your grass from reaching its greenest potential. If you've seen a decline in your lawn's health, it may help to dig in, get your hands dirty, and find the root of the problem.

Poor Soil

You will hear this time and time again; it is all about the soil. Create soil that favors turf growing conditions, and the rest will fall into place. Test your soil for nutrient content, pH and cation exchange capacity. Soil tests will indicate whether it is necessary to add lime to your lawn. Soil tests should be taken every 3 to 5 years to track improvements and alter the program as needed. Other cultural practices, like aerating, can be used to improve soil structure and add organic matter.

Compaction

Compacted soil is a terrible growing medium for lawn grass. Soil can become compacted from foot traffic, vehicle traffic, or poor soil composition—a clay- based soil, for example. Excessive compaction reduces the airspace required for healthy functioning soil and optimum plant growth, causing thin, stressed turf, which is susceptible to weeds, diseases, and pests. Compaction can be relieved by aerating, and if the cause is poor soil, top dressing with a soil amendment.

Poor Drainage

Drainage is a factor that often gets overlooked when it comes to a lawn, but it is often the root of many lawn problems, including moss and ground ivy. Soils with a heavy clay content are often the culprit of a poorly drained lawn. After rain or irrigating, the soil becomes waterlogged, and there is nowhere for the excess water to go, so it remains in the soil or on the surface interfering with vital functions within the root zone of the lawn. Subsurface drainage in the form of perforated piping may need to be installed to draw the water away from the area. The pitch of the lawn may also be altered to improve surface drainage, and once again, aerating and topdressing with a soil amendment, such as sand, can improve the drainage of the soil over time.

Too Much Shade

Although there are plenty of grass varieties available that can tolerate a fair amount of shade, lack of sun can still be a factor in a failing lawn. Using shade- tolerant grasses like fescue is part of the solution, but other measures may need to be taken. Trees can be selectively pruned to provide a little more sunlight and also improve air circulation. Many old shade trees benefit tremendously from selective pruning by providing more sunlight to the lawn and cleaning up dead branches and other issues that may arise during times of high wind.

Mowed Too Short

Finally, your lawn might very well be failing because you or your lawn care provider is mowing it too short. It happens every year, yard after yard of grass that is barely hanging on to life because it was mowed too short—mowing the lawn too short damages the crown of the plant, which is the growth center of the plant. As the grass works to recover from damaged crowns (also known as scalping), it becomes stressed. A stressed lawn is susceptible to weeds, diseases, and other pest invasions. Growing a full, lush lawn at the height of 3.5 inches reduces plant stress and crowds out weed seedlings naturally.

On the Deck

Spring migration is the perfect time attract and see far away visitors right from your own backdoor. Have an orange? Halve an orange! Or an apple for that matter. Impale it on a tree branch to feed orioles, grosbeaks, tanagers, and more. Or, try the handy dandy coat a pinecone with peanut butter and roll It in birdseed trick. Hang it from anywhere with a string. But, if you want to step it up, the cheap and easy way to attract most species is to hang a \$3 suet feeder. Nail it flush to a tree about 6 feet from the ground. Squirrels have never bothered mine. But if you're worried about that, hot pepper suet is an excellent option to try. And, if you have a seed feeder, you can have even more fun! Fill it with safflower seeds. They are a little more expensive than sunflower, but while squirrels won't eat them, several birds will! I recommend a hopper feeder because cardinals, thrushes, and robins can't use a tube feeder, but finches and chickadees will use either one. A platform feeder is attractive to almost every bird and may even earn you visits from a mourning dove or two. Place it close to a tree so distractedly eating birds won't become easy prey for the hawks.




