



HOW MANY GUESTS CAN I HAVE?

Up to four (4) guests allowed per resident over the age of 18 for use of the Trails, Town Green, Playgrounds, Amphitheater, Bandstand, and Baseball Field.

Up to two (2) guests allowed per resident over the age of 18 for use of the Swimming Pools, Tennis Courts, Volleyball Court, Basketball Court, and Outdoor Gym.

Unaccompanied children between the ages of 12 and 18 are allowed only one (1) guest while on LP property when using the amenities.

Guests are considered to be non-LP residents. LP residents that have had their privileges revoked cannot come as a guest of another resident.

A LP resident must accompany guests while on the common properties or while using any of the amenities. Long term guests (persons visiting for more than two weeks) may obtain a guest pass from the HOA office. As a reminder, homeowners are responsible for ensuring that their guests are informed of the rules of LP and that they follow the rules at all times.

HOW DO I OBTAIN AN AMENITY ID CARD AND CURRENT STICKERS?

Amenity tag stickers are distributed, by mail, in the spring of each year, if dues are paid in full. The ID card with a current sticker allows homeowners access to all of Legacy Park's common area and amenities. To get the ID card, please complete the form on our website under the Resident tab prior to stopping by the HOA office.





ur Association CC&Rs requires approval before a person/ homeowner can make any physical changes to the outside of his or her property. The committee responsible for overseeing modifications, additions, or alterations to the home or property is the ARC.

WHO CAN BE PART OF THE ARC?

ARC members are volunteers. No specific qualifications are needed to serve as a committee member, although it is helpful to have experience or knowledge in architecture, construction, landscaping, maintenance, or a related field.

WHAT ARE THE MEMBERS IN CHARGE OF?

The main responsibility of the ARC is to review plans and specifications for proposed improvements or changes to a homeowner's property. They then approve or deny the requests based on the guidelines found in the CC&Rs for the community. The ARC Committee also helps the HOA by ensuring that all homes within the community are following the guidelines stated in the governing documents regarding exterior maintenance.

Specific examples of some of the modification requests we receive are landscaping, roofs, paint selections, doors, windows, driveways, landscaping for erosion and drainage correction and more.

WHY IS THE ARC IMPORTANT TO THE HOA?

Although it may be bothersome or upsetting for a homeowner to have to submit proposed changes to the outside of their property for review, the ARC Committee is in place to keep the community looking uniform, orderly, and well maintained. This guarantees the homes within a community will retain their value, and that the community will stay looking nice over time.

CALL FOR VOLUNTEERS:

As we continue to hold standards high for maintaining our community; we also want to assure that we stay current.

PARKING ALONG LEGACY PARK CIRCLE

The fall sports are in full gear again in Legacy Park and the Circle will be crowded on Saturday mornings and throughout the fall soccer, t-ball and tennis season.

Please follow the guidelines below when parking along the circle within Legacy Park. Failure to do so could result in ticketing and/or towing by the City of Kennesaw.

- Only park on the INSIDE of the circle;
- Only park WITH the flow of traffic;
- Do not park in any area where the curb is painted white (intersections and loading/ unloading zones). It is illegal to park within 30 feet of an intersection.
- Do not park in front of fire hydrants; and
- Do not park on both sides of the street.

Additionally, if there are cars parked along the street, SLOW DOWN! It can be difficult to see a child coming out from between parked cars until it is too late. Slowing down and paying attention could save a life.

Parents, please be sure to talk to your teen driver. We know they probably won't read this.

PLEASE BE SURE YOUR EMAIL IS ON FILE WITH US!

e have two upcoming communications that we are sending via email:

Electronic Ballots for the Upcoming Board Election and 2022 Association Assessments and 2022 Budget.

For the 2019 election, we spent \$7,358 to mail all homeowners an election package for our Board. We eliminated \$3,700 in cost by only sending ballots for the election to owners that we did not have emails

for. We STILL spent \$3,650! Please help us save \$\$ and not send the mailing out to any homeowners this year via USPS.

Another way we can save money is the Association Assessment notice and Budget. Last year, the cost to send the mailing out was \$1937.04. This year, we will send it out electronically to all homeowners that we have emails for.

To make sure we have your email on file, point your browser to www.legacypark.org and select Online Payments. Sign into your

homeowner portal using the email address we have on file for you. You can select "forgot password" to reset your login. This is a great opportunity to confirm that the rest of your contact information on file with us is correct.



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2022 HOA BOARD OF DIRECTORS CALL FOR CANDIDATES

Three of the five HOA Board of Directors seats will be up for election in 2022. Do you have what it takes to be a good board member? Chances are you do. If you have a mix of some of the following traits and skills, consider running for a seat on the board. We'd love to have you.

Dedicated. You must have a passion for volunteer work since the job is essentially that. Board members don't receive pay, so all the time and effort you will put into the association should come from a place of genuine care for the community.

Respect. If you can give others respect and expect it in return, you can help keep board discussions civil, productive, and on point.

Good listening. People want to be heard. Can you listen to board members and residents with sincere interest? You may have a few ideas of your own, but everyone benefits by sharing and discussing.

Thick skin. Sometimes, residents, even other board members, can be hostile and insulting. You will encounter disputes and problems within your board or community. There will also be times when you need to make tough decisions that some homeowners might not agree with. Are you good at turning a conversation around and finding out what's really bothering people?

Egos aside. If you can give others credit, the board will operate better as a team.

Flexibility. Times are changing and technology is evolving, so you must keep an open mind if you want the best for your community.

Skill. The Association is a business. So having board members with accounting, business, legal, organizational behavior, communication, design, building, and teambuilding backgrounds can help.

The ideal board comprises a mix of management styles, professional skills, and temperaments. Board members must be able to attend a minimum of 2 monthly meetings and participate in LP activities and special meetings. You don't have to know everything when you join, but you should be familiar with the governing documents and the responsibilities of the job.



Leaders can come from different places and backgrounds. There is no one mode that fits all. Share your knowledge and passion with the community. If you know people with some of these traits or relevant skills, ask them if they'd be interested in joining the board. Some people don't think about running for a seat unless asked.

We hope you will take the time to carefully consider volunteering on the Board next year. You may nominate yourself or someone else who has agreed to be a candidate by emailing the Property Manager at propertymanager@leaacypark.ora.

WHAT IS NEEDED FROM YOU?

A biography including a brief statement of your reasons for seeking election to the Board and a summary of specific qualifications that would make you well suited for the position.

LEASING IN LEGACY PARK

If you are thinking about leasing your house in Legacy Park, here is some important information that you need to know to remain in compliance with the Association's Declaration of Covenants, Conditions, and Restrictions (CCRs). By purchasing a property in Legacy Park, you agreed to comply with the CCRs.

Houses in Legacy Park may only be leased in their entirety, for the exclusive occupancy by any person, other than the Owner for which the owner receives any consideration or benefit, including, but not limited to a fee, service, gratuity, or emolument.

You will violate the CCRs if you choose to use your property for timesharing, fraction-sharing, or a similar program whereby the right to the exclusive use of any Unit rotates among participants in the program. Rental programs such as Airbnb and VROB are not permitted.

If you plan to lease your property, below is a list of requirements:

- The minimum lease term must be no less than 12 months.
- Owners must submit a fully executed copy of the lease to the HOA within 10 days that includes an Owner & Tenant Acknowledgment or be charged a \$25 per day fine until it is received.
- The owner must ensure that their current address and email are on file with the HOA.
- The owner must be current on HOA fees.
- Keep in mind that, as the owner, you are responsible for the behavior of your tenants at the amenity areas, and in compliance with the covenants. Should there be any fines issued for non-compliance, that fee is yours to pay, and collecting it from the tenant is the owner's responsibility.

REMINDER ABOUT SIGNAGE FROM THE DESIGN STANDARDS IV.K.

- 2. No sign of any kind may be erected on any common property without the prior approval of the Property Manager, except signs required by legal proceeding. Violation of this rule will result in an immediate fine of \$25 per sign.
- 4. Campaign signs for candidates for elected office, less than 2'x



2', may be erected on individual properties no more than 30 days prior to an election date and must be removed within 48 hours after the polls close. A maximum of three (3) signs are allowed per yard.

RESPECT THY NEIGHBOR

Recently the HOA office has received phone calls from homeowners concerned about other people, mostly children, using their property as shortcuts.

Please remember that each home in the community is privately owned. Unauthorized access of private property is trespassing, in which case the homeowner could choose to contact the Kennesaw Police regarding the trespasser.

Many residents do not realize that the Association does not own any area between the houses and the neighborhoods. What may look like an undeveloped common area is probably someone's backyard!

The Association would like to remind you and your family to be respectful of your neighbors and their private property.



HOLIDAY DISPLAYS

(Design Standards and CC&Rs dated 11/17/20) Page 13

Holiday displays must not create a nuisance for adjacent property owners. All holiday decorations including lighting displays must not attract increased traffic flow.

Holiday season displays may only be used from Thanksgiving through the weekend following New Years Day. Decorations for other holidays may only be displayed up to two (2) weeks in advance of the occasion, or the month of the occasions whichever is longer, and must be removed no later than seven (7) days following the holiday.

PARKING



Please remember to be courteous to your neighbors and refrain from parking on the street. The office has received complaints about cars parked in unsafe

areas, such as hills and curves making driving around LP hazardous. Garage first, then driveway.

TUNE IN TO OUR ONLINE MEETINGS

Whether you're out of town or out of commission, you can keep tabs on association board meetings by tuning in online. For many years, residents have requested the Board to live-stream their monthly meetings. In September 2020, it happened and continues today, including the Annual Meeting in February 2021.

Our online meeting tool Microsoft Teams allows residents to hear board and staff members. Residents who join are muted until such time the Board give you the opportunity to speak; you can type any questions you have in the chat window as well.

Whether you're physically present or joining us virtually for the meeting, we'll ask all participants to:

- Be professional, courteous, and considerate
- Avoid rustling papers or creating other noise
- Refrain from talking when others are speaking

And if you're calling in:

- The HOA will unmute you, if you want to make a comment during open forum, please announce yourself before talking
- Mute your phone/computer unless you're talking and especially if there is background noise, such as a barking dog, etc.

You're still encouraged to join us in person onsite for the meeting, but if you can't, we also want to give you the opportunity to follow what business is transacting in your community.

There is still time to join this committee if you are interested! The only qualifications is that you must be a Legacy Park resident and a current 8th to 12th grader.


This is their GROUP! They decide where they will be impactful in our community.



LANDSCAPE TIPS FOR OCTOBER

- Mow, trim and edge lawn areas
- Prune shrubs as needed
- Inspect trees, shrubs and turf for insect and disease (treat as necessary)
- Begin flower maintenance (deadheading, fertilization and weeding as necessary)
- Begin leaf removal
- Apply post-emergent to control weeds as necessary
- Aerate
- Fertilize trees and shrubs with a balanced fertilizer
- Apply pre-emergent to warm season turf (Control fall and winter weeds)
- Continue installation of fall color
- Start transplanting shrubs
- Divide perennials such as hosta and daylilies


















MATT COOPER

The work that Matt and his team do is not only trailblazing but sets the standard for many other sports stadiums and arenas around the country. Matt has hosted some of the most momentous events, including Super Bowl LIII, NCA National Championship, the 2018 MLS Championship in which he was awarded a Championship ring, and most recently the Black Music Walk of Fame.

Matt began working in an Indian Restaurant at the age of 14. For 12 years, Matt continued to work in the food industry which led to an opportunity that began his career path, Sous Chef for Turner Field for the Atlanta Braves. At that time, Matt set a goal to become an Executive Chef and accomplished it before the age of 30. He was then offered the Executive Sous Chef position with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers. At that point in his career, Matt knew that he would need to focus on his craft to reach his full potential to become an Executive Chef. Without formal training or culinary school, Matt was told he would never succeed as a Chef. That made him more adamant about achieving his goal. After years of traveling to various stadiums, arenas, convention centers & amphitheaters, Matt was able to hone his craft.


It was then that he knew he was ready. On a trip back to Atlanta to see family, Matt drove by Mercedes Benz Stadium during the construction phase and saw this as his moment to take everything he learned and perfected over the years and put to work. After numerous interviews and tastings, Matt was offered the Executive Sous Chef position. After only two months of creating systems and procedures for the stadium and putting his stamp on each department, he was offered the Executive Chef position. To help understand the magnitude of Matt's responsibilities at the stadium, he is in charge of 200 luxury suites, 53 concession stands, seven clubs/ restaurants, and high-end non-game day catering.

When Matt isn't at MBS, he is working on "Rest Atlanta," a program he hopes to bridge the gap between leftover food and food insecurity by collaborating with locals to help feed the community.

When Covid-19 hit the US and our country locked down, Matt and his team would show up daily to prepare 5,000 full meals per week. The meals were delivered door-to-door throughout the city to help feed the community that was harshly affected by the pandemic. Matt has also helped create the food donation program with Second Helpings Atlanta. With this program, the team at Mercedes Benz Stadium takes all the leftover food and creates excellent meals that get distributed throughout the city.

When it comes to the Food & Beverage program at Mercedes-Benz Stadium, Matt and his team do a fantastic job of staying ahead of the curve when it comes to creativity and innovation.

IMPORTANT MODIFICATION INFORMATION

The best place to have your questions answered is the HOA office. Contact us if you have any questions related to the HOA, such as amenities, covenants, etc. or visit our website www. legacypark.org to receive our community's covenants and design guidelines.

All modifications to the exterior of any home and the property, must be approved by the Architectural Review Committee (ARC) before any work begins. This includes, but is not limited to; roofing, windows, exterior doors, painting (present colors are not automatically approved), landscaping (including removal and replacement of aging shrubs and plantings, flower bed borders), fire pits, trampolines, etc. Please note there is a \$250 fine for any unapproved modification and you will be required to correct/remove the modification. Please also note, that backyard modifications must also be approved, even if it is not visible from the street.

Here are some items that we commonly receive calls about that are NOT permitted: sheds, car covers, RV/trailers/boats, commercial vehicles, blinds, curtains (other than white backed curtains or blinds, or natural wood blinds), landscape lighting, statuary/and other manmade objects, or rocks as ground cover, unless it has been approved to correct drainage issues.

Lastly, all tree removals must first be approved by the City of Kennesaw, and a letter from the HOA will follow the City's approval.



- For a Home Modification Application, go to www.legacypark.org , click FAQ and locate the form in HOA Information.
- For a paint modification, please include the manufacturer and the full name of the color (i.e., Sherwin Williams Balanced Beige SW7037), pictures of your house (all sides) and pictures of the houses next to you showing their current color.
- For all other modification requests, please include the description on the form as well as the following:
- Landscaping: Include a detailed drawing with placement & types of plantings and pictures of the entire work area and pictures of materials to be used (pavers, borders, etc.)
- Additions (patios, firepits, trampoline, pool, hot tub, retaining walls etc.): Include a detailed drawing with measurements and materials, pictures of the entire work area and a survey/plat showing your property lines.
- Windows: Include pictures of all the windows to be replaced and pictures & description of the new windows.
- Fence: Include a detailed drawing with measurements & type of fence, pictures

- of the entire work area and a survey/plat showing your property lines.
- Roof: Include the manufacturer and the full name of the color (i.e., Owens Corning Duration Onyx Black).

All modifications will be reviewed by the Architectural Review Committee (ARC) in a closed meeting on the evening of the 2nd Wednesday of every month.

All requests must be submitted by Noon on the 2nd Wednesday to: modifications@legacypark.org.

- Please make sure you have everything that
 is required for your modification request.
 The information you provide is what will
 be submitted to the ARC. If information
 is missing or incorrect, your modification
 request will be denied for not enough
 information.
- Decisions will be mailed or emailed if you are signed up in Buildium. Please be patient as it could take several business days after the meeting to process all of the modification requests.

Modification Approvals expire 1 year from the date of approvals.
