

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FINANCIAL REPORT

s 2021 comes to an end, this was not the return to "normal" that most people were anticipating this time last year.

If you have not already received it, a detailed financial summary letter and the approved Legacy Park (LP) Budget for 2022 have been sent out via email (if on file) or USPS (if no email on file).

As in years past, the Finance Committee made up of volunteer LP homeowners, in partnership with the Staff and the Board of Directors, coordinated the budgeting process. The group was challenged to balance the budget as costs have increased in several areas:

Increase in Contracts from 2021:

- Pool Contract up 27%
- Landscape Contract up 13%
- Spirit of America
 - Fireworks up 25%
 - Jumpies up 35%

Anticipate a 10% increase in Utilities

The Staff submitted requests for

proposals for services in an attempt to decrease costs or improve services. In some instances, you will see new service providers next year on our property. However, at the end of the process, all contracts have a higher cost associated with the services. The existing dues with projected revenue could not support the additional expenses.

In order to balance our budget, the Legacy Park Board of Directors voted unanimously for the 2022 Assessments to increase:

- Legacy Park \$700
- Northgate \$525

Legacy Park Assessments are still a great value. Twenty years ago, the dues were \$525. Simply just adding the annual inflation rate from 2001 to 2020, the dues would be \$768 in 2020. Additionally, the original assessment did not encompass the additional amenities we have incorporated and maintained (a clubhouse, outdoor fitness center, indoor fitness center, office, and a splash pad). Also, the HOA "self-insures" items that are not coverable by insurance in the case of flooding as seen in 2005, 2009, and 2020 when significant trail repair had to be completed.

COVENANT ENFORCEMENT

s we are approaching the end of the year, it's time to assess what needs to be done at our homes in the coming year. Take a step outside and look at your house. What should be on your project list?

THINGS TO CONSIDER:

- **Siding** have you been keeping it clean? Has it faded? How long ago has it been since it was painted?
- Driveways/walkways it's time to power wash if they are showing anything from dark spots, oil spills, dirt and/or mold.
- Mailboxes and Gaslights are they painted high gloss black? Does the mailbox have worn gold or silver address paint? Are any numbers missing? Does the gaslight have the cross bar or is it missing or broken? Paint pens are available to borrow from the HOA (for mailbox numbers). Cross bars (for the gas lights) can be purchased for \$15 from the HOA and the brass numbers for the mailbox for \$5 each from the HOA.
- Garage doors are they in good shape? Do they need replacing because they're old with rotting wood? Have there been a few too many basketball games played against them in the driveway? Was a new driver getting used to the difference between the gas and brake pedals, or maybe even a frazzled parent juggling ten things at once forgot to hit the brakes in time? Whatever the case may be...time to repair or replace.
- **Shutters and gutters** are they broken, hanging or missing? Time to get someone out there to repair or replace them.
- **Empty beds/and or beds with dying shrubs** time to for a complete re-do. See below for more information on this.
- Lawns -may need re-sodding because weed treatment was either too little or too late.

If needed, we can guide you through the process with assistance in finding contractors, selecting colors or a second opinion for landscaping ideas.

In some instances, our Landscape Committee helped homeowners with bed design and types of plants, suggesting low maintenance but aesthetically pleasing ones and taking the homeowner's personal tastes and needs into consideration.

That all being said....

Legacy Park has been such a haven for Gabrielle and myself and I can't imagine having raised her anywhere but here.



IMPORTANT ANNOUNCEMENT: THE CHARACTER OF LEGACY PARK!

oday's homebuyers not only compete with other buyers looking for their perfect

place to call home but often get outbid by hedge funds purchasing investment properties. This is happening nationwide, and more and more companies have decided that Legacy Park is a good investment as well.

So far this year, we have had 120 resales. This number is 10% over our anticipated number (based on historical numbers). However, although the overall number of resales is about the same, we are seeing an increase in the number of purchasers that never intend to

Currently, Legacy Park has 183 rental homes, which is 10.5% of our community. Of those 183 homes, 55% or 98 are company-owned. When companies started purchasing homes in Legacy Park,

American Homes for Rent, Invitation Homes, Progress

Residential, etc., were the predominant buyers; however, we now have many new investment companies that are simply acronyms.

Our Covenants cannot prohibit the number of homes that are leased in the neighborhood.

However, the HOA does enforce the covenants equally regardless of if it is owner-occupied or not. Not surprisingly, the properties owned by corporations end up with ongoing violations since they do not

see their property regularly and unattended items can get out of control quickly. As a community, we seek to have any

violation corrected so neighbors don't have to endure an unsightly property; however, due to lack of communication and action by an owner, fines tend to be charged.

Legacy Park is now 26 years old. The community and homes require more maintenance and repairs to keep the neighborhood at the standard we all enjoy. How do we continue to achieve this with the number of investment properties quickly growing?

The HOA is forming a committee to discuss solutions to preserve the character of Legacy Park as a predominantly owner-occupied neighborhood as opposed to a rental community. If you would like to be part of the solution – we need you! Please send an email to PropertyManager@LegacyPark.org.

We will have a meeting in January with everyone interested.

TAX EXEMPTION

t's the most wonderful time of the year for not just you and your family, but for thieves, too.

They're making a list and checking it twice – and we don't mean Santa and his

Burglars know the holiday season is a prime time to stock up on some goodies of their own. They plan to take advantage of unsuspecting individuals who may be more focused on merrymaking than keeping safe from theft and fraud.

Thefts and break-ins typically skyrocket during the holiday season because thieves know many families leave their homes and cars unattended and sometimes even unlocked.

Insurance might cover these thefts, but it won't alleviate the victim's violation of privacy concerns or restore their confidence in being safe and secure. Further, some items have more sentimental value than monetary.

All said, the after-effects of theft linger long after the item or its monetary value has been recouped.

Here are 8 steps that you can take to ward off holiday theft:

8 - MIND YOUR PACKAGE DELIVERIES.

It just takes a few minutes for a thief to drive through an area to see if packages are sitting on porches or stoops. If deliveries are expected at your residence, make sure you get them in as quickly as possible. Ask a neighbor to help you if you will not be around. Utilize Delivery Manager (FedEx) or MyChoice (UPS) to give you some control over their delivery schedule.

7 - SECURE ALL ENTRIES.

Not all thieves enter through your front door. It's a good idea to keep all windows and doors locked when not in use. When traveling, make sure any alarms or security cameras are enabled and working correctly. Neighbors are an excellent resource to keep an eye on your home when you are away as well.

6 - LIGHT IT UP.

When traveling, keep the home's exterior lights on, and use a timer to turn indoor lights on and off. The thief may be fooled into thinking you are home by keeping lights on and setting decorations and lights on an automatic timer.

5 - HOLD THE MAIL.

Nothing screams Empty Home like a stack of newspapers or a full mailbox. When traveling, ask a neighbor to check your mail or go to the post office and place a hold on it. Stop delivery of newspapers for the period you'll be gone or have a friend or neighbor pick them up.

4 - HIDE SHOPPING BAGS IN YOUR CAR.

With all the hustle and bustle of shopping and running errands, it can be easy to leave your bags,

packages, and gifts in the backseat of your car. It is not uncommon for thieves to walk or drive through a mall parking lot and check for unlocked doors, open windows, and packages in plain view. Be sure to always lock the doors, roll up the windows, and hide your purchases or put them in the trunk of your car so that you don't become an easy target.

3 – PROTECT THE CASH.

Many purses are stolen from shopping carts as customers are perusing store items. If you must use a shopping cart for your purse, hook the handle through the arm and ensure the zipper is closed.

Consider removing most of your debit or credit cards from your purse before shopping. Keep a written copy of the phone numbers to the credit card company or back so that you can easily report any that are stolen.

2 - BE AWARE OF YOUR SURROUNDINGS.

When parking your vehicle, take note of your surroundings. Watch for suspicious activity or anyone following you. If possible, park in high traffic and well-lit areas.

1 - SHOP SMART ONLINE.

When shopping online, stick with retailers known for their customer service, just in case one of your orders fails to arrive or disappears.

2022 BOARD OF DIRECTORS ELECTION

Three of the five Board of Directors seats are up for election in 2022. Nominations were submitted by November 4, 2021. Biographies and headshots of the candidates are included in this newsletter and posted on the HOA website (under the FAQ tab).

We are working on a date for the virtual candidate's forum to be held in January.

Electronic voting will once again be utilized with Vote-Now. Vote-Now manages the entire voting process. No one outside of that company has knowledge of any voting results. The email address we have on file for you will be provided to Vote-Now unless you ask us not to share it with them.

The voting results will be announced at the February 2022 Annual Meeting, which will be streamed online. The results are sent to the HOA in a sealed envelope the day of the Annual Membership Meeting. The reason I am running for the 2022 Legacy Park Board is simple and I only have two goals. The first goal is to sustain Legacy Park's renowned community reputation. The second goal is to ensure the steady and sure growth of our home values. To achieve these goals the Legacy Park Board must:

- Preserve our amenities in immaculate condition.
- Ensure the pristine condition of all Legacy Park communities and the homes within them.
- Foster mutual respect between the members and the Board.
- Proactively monitor and control Legacy Park's budget.

For the first time in 20+ years, Legacy Park's 2022-projected budget will be in the red, even with another first, an assessment increase twice the amount assessed in previous years, at least \$30 per household, if not more. Additionally, the projected 2022 budget includes provisions for new amenities with their forever maintenance expenses even though the projected budget will be in the red without a significant assessment increase. There was a time in Legacy Park's 20+year history new amenities were necessary to enhance the value of Legacy Park, so assessment increases were justified. However, that time has passed. I now believe Legacy Park has enough amenities to retain and attract new members. Therefore, instead of spending more money with the legal right to increase our assessments to offset the increased expenses, the staff and the Board should proactively explore ways to decrease our expenses, thereby, negating the need for a historic assessment increase. That should be Legacy Park's go to budget process.

It is my sincere hope that everyone has had a prosperous and meaningful 2021 and that those blessings continue into 2022 and beyond.




